

Fort Worth Stock Show Tips for Students

- 1. Make sure you pay attention to the advisors about what you need, where you need to be and when.
- 2. Bring a chair.
- 3. You will need money for eating and shopping. But bring snacks too.
- 4. Eat a cinnamon roll. And a loaded baked potato.
- 5. Bring a variety of clothes. It's going to be cold, but you really warm up walking your animal.
- 6. Start a group text with kids and parents in your breed. Helps with schedules. Some classes go faster than others.
- 7. Don't bother with hair and make-up until after you bathe your animal. There are places in the barn to get ready.
- 8. If you leave the grounds during the day, you probably won't have anywhere to park when you return.
- 9. Get your animal used to the footing in the area leading up to the ring and in the ring.
- 10.Practice in the show ring in the days before show if allowed. Get comfortable in there.
- 11.Get familiar with where you go in the arena and the make ready area before you show.
- 12.If you have a lamb, make sure you have someone to hand your halter to before you enter the ring.
- 13. Watch other people show. Watch the judge. Watch the ring stewards.
- 14.Be prepared for possible questions from the judge.
- 15. Support your fellow GCFFA members.
- 16.Don't just sit in the pen all day lots to see and do.
- 17.Go to the rodeo.
- 18.Remember that the FWSSR is attended by 1.5 million people. Many have never set foot on a ranch or in a barn. Be a good ambassador ©
- 19.Go to the parade. Lots of horses. No motorized vehicles. Old tradition.
- 20.Be prepared and do your best, but showing livestock is much more than a place in a class line-up.
- 21. The actual time spent in the show ring is very short. Make the most of your whole FWSSR experience. Enjoy the opportunity to participate in this Fort Worth tradition that started in 1896.

Fort Worth Stock Show Tips for Families

Here are some tips from veteran Stock Show families:

- 1. Make sure your student is paying attention to the advisors and communicating with you about what they need, where they need to be and when.
- 2. The lamb barn is dusty! More so than any of the other ones. Just so you know.
- 3. Bring a chair. There will be lots of sitting for kids and parents.
- 4. The lamb and goat barns are crowded. Not much room, but people get pretty creative.
- 5. Your grounds pass also gets you into the Museum of Science and History, National Cowgirl Museum and Cattle Raisers Museum.
- 6. You're going to need more \$ than you think for food and shopping.
- 7. Bring snacks. For your child and for the group.
- 8. Get out of the barn and walk around!
- 9. Start a group text with kids and parents in your breed. Helps with schedules. Some classes go faster than others.
- 10.Lamb and goat families save seats early on show morning, especially if you're in an early class. Or save seats as a group and rotate in and out of the stands.
- 11. Consider a wagon or cart for hauling all your stuff in and out of the barn.
- 12.If you leave the grounds during the day, you probably won't have anywhere to park when you return.
- 13.Go to the rodeo.
- 14.Go to the parade. Lots of horses. No motorized vehicles. Old tradition.
- 15.Parking/traffic might be worse than normal because of the new arena construction.
- 16.Step outside behind the barns and watch the kids walk their animals in the parking lot ©

Buyer and Add-on Letters for Tarrant County Junior Livestock Show

Buyer/Add-On letters are a way for students to raise money for their livestock projects above and beyond auction or market price. They are also a great way to tell your community what you've been working on. Many people are eager to support hard working youth who are working to preserve involvement in agriculture and ranching, as well as help them invest in larger projects.

You do not have to make sale to receive add-ons.

- Your letters should be mailed about a month before county. If your student is showing at FWSSR, this is a great time to get a photo of your student and their project to use in your letters.
- Who do you send letters to? Family, friends, neighbors, business associates, community businesses, doctors, etc. Start making your list and gathering addresses now.
- You can have add-ons sent directly to you and turn them in on sale day. Or you can have them sent to TCJLS, but you won't be able to track them.
- You can register and bid on your child's project.
